Out of My Mind

As you are well aware, these are unprecedented times. Because of the Pandemic, much of what used to be normal and routine, just doesn't work at the moment. That also applies to how we function as the church. Obviously we have had to make changes in how we worship, such as moving it out of the sanctuary to online, but our adjustments haven't ended there. In addition nearly all in person meetings – whether Sunday School classes, committees, other meetings and Deacons have either not taken place or have continued as Zoom meetings. With that being the case, how does the church function? How do we make the decisions that need to be made?

Fortunately our church constitution provides direction for this situation. Article III, Section 9. Line D states that the Deacons shall: "Act as an executive committee of the church in emergency situations calling for such prompt action that a call for a special business meeting of the church is impractical."

Because of the Pandemic, business meetings, whether quarterly or special in nature, are certainly impractical at this time. With this in mind, the Deacons have voted that the Pandemic qualifies as just the sort of emergency situation that the constitution envisioned, and so they will fulfill their responsibility to act as an executive committee for the church, until such time as when the church can safely regather for business meetings and make decisions in the usual ways.

One of the decisions the deacons have made is to follow the example of the Virginia Baptist state convention (BGAV) and extend this year's nominating committee assignments into next year. They are encouraging each volunteer, if at all possible, to remain in their current positions, even if they were scheduled to rotate off their assignment for the time being.

Also, the Stewardship and Budget Committee, which will be meeting soon to consider the 2021 Church Budget, is being asked to make as few adjustments as necessary to the budget. The Deacons will review and vote upon any changes to the budget.

Please know that the Deacons' view this functioning as an executive committee for the church as a temporary situation and as soon as the church can safely resume business meetings will gladly hand the decision making responsibility back to those groups deemed as responsible in the constitution.




Parents and Children,
